CHEMICALS THAT DECREASE THE

OPIOIDS LIKE VICODIN, OXYCONTIN, AND
PERCOCET, ARE MAN-MADE DRUGS AND
MIMIC THE PAINKILLING EFFECTS OF
NATURAL OPIOIDS.
